ANÁLISIS ARTÍSTICO

Here, Goya does not represent the carnival scene in the same way as he did in *The Burial of the Sardine*, blending happiness and fun with madness and danger. In this case, he focuses all attention on the woman who is at the centre of the composition, dressed in a fancy skirt and wearing make-up. Near her are various figures, including a man wearing a pointy hat who is placed behind the woman.
